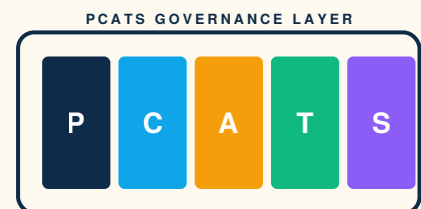

02 · The Reference Architecture

PCATS: the governance layer for agent execution.

Policy, Control, Audit, Traceability, Safety. Five planes. Every read scoped, every write gated, every action logged, reversible, and answerable. The moat between a **useful agent and a deployable one**.

03 · The Loop

Consolidate. Connect. Deploy.

Four core hubs. Six enterprise connector classes. Three anchor agents to start — forty in the library. A ninety-day rollout with governance gates before every production write. **Each step compounds the value of the last.**

04 · The Outcome

Judgment, not journaling.

Briefs are already written. Case queues are already triaged. Systems of record are already current. The audit trail is already query-able. Your best analysts spend their week on the questions that **require a human**.

Chief officers and boards: pages 2, 6 (PCATS), 14 (Governance Overlay), and 20 (Where to Next). Enterprise architects and delivery leaders: cover-to-cover. Model risk, compliance, and audit teams: pages 6, 14, 17 (Examiner Walkthrough), and 18. Every page is self-contained — skip freely.

Your best people are the integration between your systems of record.

In regulated enterprises, work sits across the core, the CRM, the case platform, the compliance stack, the policy library, the shared drives, and the email thread where a decision actually happened. Your best analysts spend their days stitching it together — **a job description no one wrote, and no examiner will accept as an operating model.**

The cost is not hours. It is **audit findings on reconstructed rationale, examiner questions answered from memory, SLA breaches, control failures, and client-response latency** your peer institutions do not carry. The five best analysts in your BSA/AML unit, your prior-auth team, your deal desk, or your underwriting bench spend most of their week being APIs between systems that should already talk to each other.

CAIBots changes what is possible. The workspace stops being a filing cabinet and becomes **a governed context layer that agents read, reason over, and act on inside your systems of record** — with every read scoped, every write gated, every action logged, timestamped, actor-signed, and reversible. Which means:

- ✓ **Your policy library becomes runtime fuel for agents** — not just reference material a person Ctrl-Fs before a filing. Agents cite policy on every write.
- ✓ **Your systems of record update themselves** from email, meetings, cases, and messages — with the audit trail produced as a byproduct, not an afterthought.
- ✓ **Your compliance and risk briefs write themselves** before regulators or auditors ask — and the answer to "show me what happened, when, why, and who authorized it" is a report, never a reconstruction.
- ✓ **Your Model Risk Management function gets a new class of artifact** — SR 11-7 aligned documentation on every agent, every version, every material decision it took.

THE TRANSFORMATION, IN ONE LINE

Reconstructing an audit trail from Slack, Outlook, and five systems → a governed agent that builds and maintains the record of decision for you, inside your systems of record, with PCATS-logged provenance you can hand to an examiner.

Four verticals. Four workflows. One better way.

High-frequency regulated workflows once the loop is in place. One card per vertical, one shift per card. The pattern is the same, the systems and citations change.

FINANCIAL SERVICES

OLD · PERPETUAL KYC REVIEW BY HAND

Analyst pulls counterparty data from four systems, cross-checks sanctions lists in a spreadsheet, files a memo. Repeat next quarter, or when a beneficial-owner change gets noticed weeks late.

NEW · KYC / AML COMPLIANCE AGENT

Agent monitors ownership signals, re-scores risk, cross-references sanctions and adverse media, pre-fills SAR draft, files the audit trail. BSA/AML and SR 11-7 aligned by design.

CAPITAL MARKETS

OLD · MANUALLY UPDATING THE DEAL BOOK

A term sheet moves in email, a call happens, but the origination system does not know until someone remembers. Audit reconstruction begins the day the regulator calls.

NEW · SELF-UPDATING DEAL DESK

Agents watch email and meeting notes, update stage and rationale, route dual approvals. Dodd-Frank and MiFID II aligned. Decision rationale captured on every write.

INSURANCE

OLD · CHASING CLAIMS FOLLOW-UPS

After every claim call, the adjuster replays notes, writes a recap, checks coverage against policy and endorsements, chases the customer. Fraud is scored days later, if at all.

NEW · CLAIMS ADJUDICATION AGENT

Meetings transcribe and summarize. Coverage is verified against policy. Fraud is scored at intake. Documents requested automatically. NAIC and State DOI aligned.

HEALTHCARE

OLD · WRITING PRIOR-AUTH UPDATES

Every Friday the team reconstructs the week from EMR notes, payer portals, and five docs to produce the utilization-review update — the day productivity metrics are already published.

NEW · DAILY STANDUP BRIEFING AGENT

Agent compiles progress from cases, notes, and payer comms into a daily brief — delivered before you ask. HIPAA-grounded, PHI-safe, verifiable against the source of record.

THE PATTERN

Each old workflow is a person being an API. Each new workflow is a governed agent doing the write and producing the audit evidence as a byproduct. **The distinction is not automation. The distinction is governance.** A robotic process automation script also does the write — but cannot cite the policy, log the decision, reverse the action, or answer the examiner. Governed agents can.

Three steps. One compounding system.

03

Each step makes the next one stronger. Once all three run, the system maintains itself — and every new connector, hub, and agent compounds the value of the ones already deployed. This is the shape of the whole playbook.

Give the enterprise one governed home for the four things every regulated business runs on. Before agents can act, the record of truth has to exist somewhere structured enough to read and write.

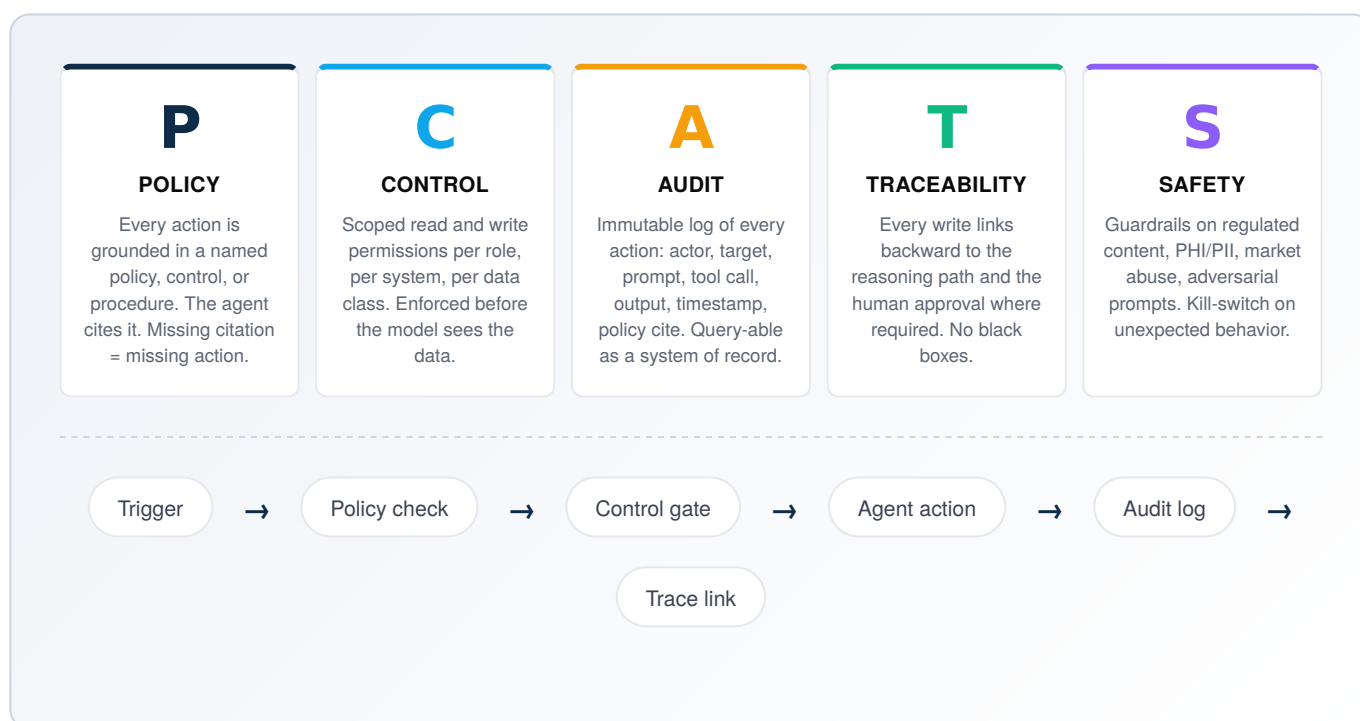

PCATS: the governance layer for agent execution.

The distinction between a chatbot and a governed enterprise agent is not what it says. It is **what happens between the model and the write**. PCATS is the layer that sits there. Five planes, in-line on every action, non-optional, and observable end-to-end.



For Model Risk Management

Each agent is a first-class model artifact under SR 11-7. Version, purpose, boundaries, monitoring, and evidence — all first-class fields, not documentation debt.

For Compliance & Audit

Every material action is a queryable row. "Show me every write this agent made to the KYC system last quarter" is a report, not a project.

For InfoSec

Control plane enforces least-privilege scoping before the model sees data. No agent has broader access than the role it substitutes for.

For Legal & Boards

Reversibility is a design principle, not a hope. Every write is undoable, every decision is answerable, every action has a named accountable owner.

STEP 1

Build your core hubs

Goal: give the enterprise a governed home outside of scattered systems and Slack threads. Before agents can work for you, there has to be a structured, permissioned, versioned place where the business actually lives — and where PCATS can enforce policy on the read.

START GOVERNABLE, NOT PERFECT

Your hubs do not need to be complete on day one — they need to be governable. A five-property Case & Workflow database with owner, status, SLA, evidence, and policy citation is enough for the anchor agents. Complete comes with time. Governable has to be from day one, or you cannot ship.

What each hub needs to be agent-ready

A few consistent properties are all a governed agent needs to read and write reliably — and all an examiner needs to reconstruct what happened. Start here, extend as the workflow demands. Every property is a first-class field, not a free-text note.

Why consolidation is the unlock

- ✔ A case links to the counterparty it concerns, the policy that governs it, the meeting where the decision was made, the model documentation for the agent that acted, and the audit evidence proving it happened. **One graph, four hubs, zero orphans.**
- ✔ Enterprise search works across **everything the governance layer indexes** — connected systems included — with role-based permissions preserved on every result.
- ✔ **Consolidated, governed knowledge = capable, accountable agents. Scattered knowledge = agents that guess.** A regulator will forgive slow. A regulator will not forgive guessing.

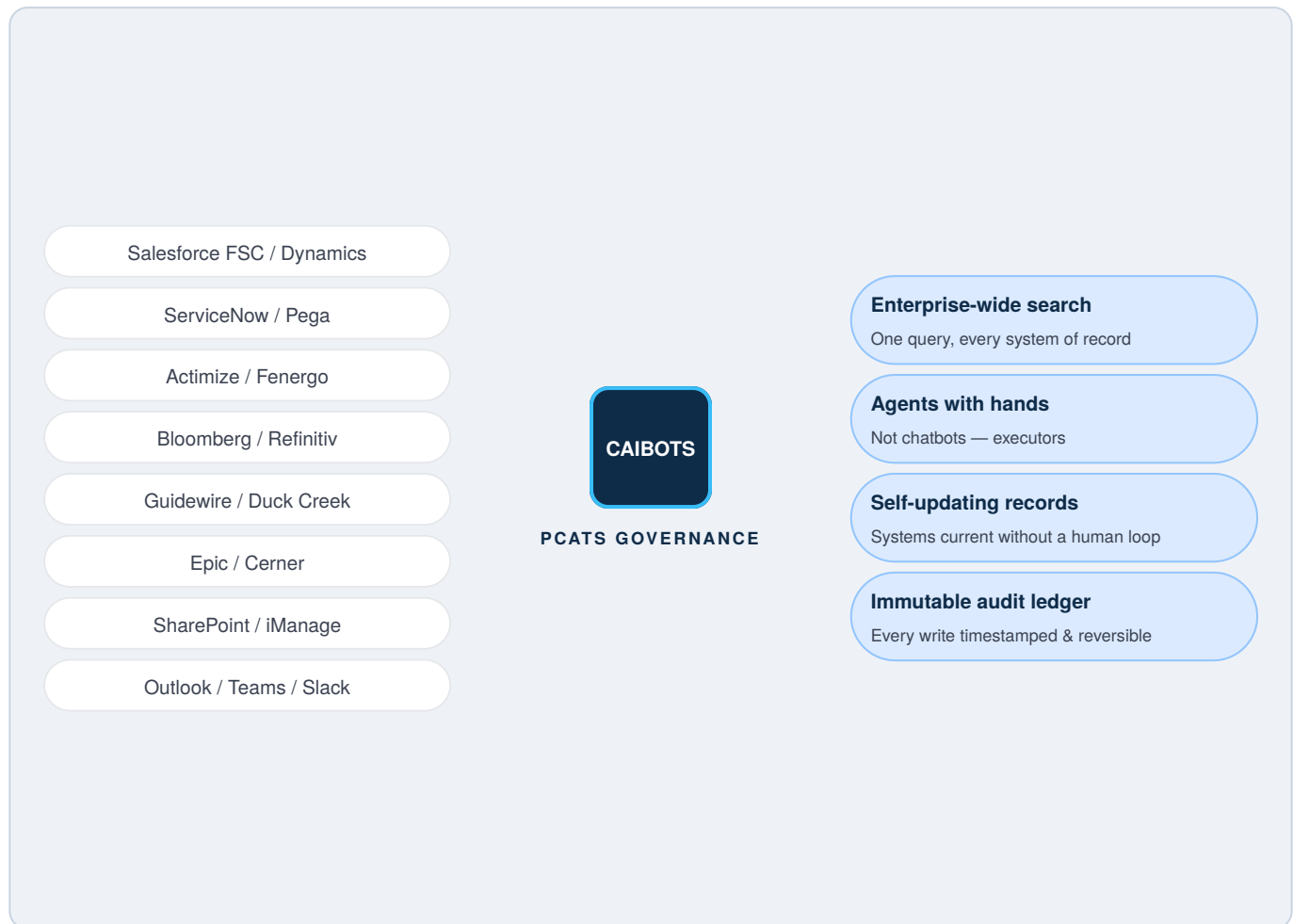
RULE OF THUMB

If a decision, relationship, control, or piece of work matters in 30 days — or to an examiner in 3 years — it belongs in one of your four hubs. **Not in a chat thread. Not in a folder. Not in an inbox.**

STEP 2

Connect your systems of record

Goal: open the pipes. Your business already happens in the CRM, the case system, the compliance stack, the core, and the email thread. Connectors are how that reality flows into the governance layer where agents can safely act on it — every read scoped, every write gated, every action logged.



You stop being the integration.

Your senior analysts are the API between your systems today — reading in one, retyping into another, briefing the examiner from memory. Governed connectors retire that job. Information gets in **and out** without a person copying, pasting, or reconstructing. The audit trail is a byproduct of the work happening, not a project after it.

ENTERPRISE REALITY

You are not connecting a productivity stack. You are connecting **systems of record whose data has regulatory weight**. Every connector goes through the PCATS governance layer — read permissions scoped, write permissions gated, every action logged. **The pipe is not the connector. The pipe is the connector plus the governance overlay.**

The enterprise connector stack

Connect the systems where regulated decisions actually happen, in order of decision volume. Every connector compounds the value of enterprise search, your agents, and your hubs simultaneously.

Setting it up — the order that compounds

- ① **Connect CRM & case management first.** These power intake triage, workflow enforcement, and the deal-desk agent — the highest-leverage automations for a regulated team.
- ② **Add the compliance stack next.** Once connected, KYC/AML, sanctions monitoring, and SAR pre-file drafting move from a monthly effort to a continuous one.
- ③ **Add document repositories & the collaboration layer.** Policies, contracts, decks, emails, and chats surface in the same governed search as everything else — permissioned per role.

STEP 3

Deploy governed agents

Goal: turn your consolidated, connected workspace into a governed workforce. This is where the manual reconciliation starts disappearing — and where the audit trail starts writing itself.

3A · MAKE YOUR WORKSPACE AGENT-READABLE

- ✓ **Write decisions where agents can see them.** Verbal agreements land in the CRM. Slack decisions land in the case system. If it happened in a conversation and matters tomorrow, it exists as a structured row with a policy citation and a named owner.
- ✓ **Use structured databases over freeform docs for anything recurring.** Structured properties (status, owner, control ID, evidence link) are what agents read and update reliably. Freeform is for narrative. Databases are for execution.
- ✓ **Keep a context page per major function.** A short page: what this business unit does, who the regulators are, how decisions get made, what the escalation path is. Agents reference these the way a new hire would — and the way an auditor will.

3B · THE THREE ANCHOR AGENTS

Start with the three agents that touch the most work, produce the most audit evidence, and demonstrate the loop within the first 90 days. Ready-made versions ship with the CAIBots Agent Library (page 13).

KYC / AML Compliance Agent

Monitors ownership signals, re-screens counterparties, flags sanctions matches and adverse media, pre-fills SAR drafts, routes to compliance officer.

- ✎ One-click examiner evidence pack

GET THESE THREE RIGHT — THE REST IS ITERATION

These three anchor agents produce more audit-defensible artifacts in a quarter than most compliance teams produce in a year. Deploy them first, then extend the pattern to the next ten workflows from the Agent Library. **The compounding accelerates from here.**

Three parts everyone builds. One part that ships you.

Consumer AI tools give you instructions, connections, triggers. That is enough for a small business. In a regulated enterprise, an agent that lacks the fourth part is not deployable — it is a memo waiting to happen.

01 · Instructions

The job description

Written in natural language, grounded in your policy library. What you want it to do, the boundaries it must not cross, the escalation path when it is uncertain.

02 · Connections

The systems it acts on

Read & write scopes to your hubs, CRM, case system, compliance stack, collaboration layer — permissioned per role, per data class, per system.

03 · Triggers

When it runs

On a schedule, on a database change, on an inbound signal (email, alert, regulator filing), or when a human @-mentions it in the case.

04 · Governance Overlay

PCATS enforcement

Every action passes through Policy, Control, Audit, Traceability, Safety planes. Reversible. Logged. Cited. Human-approved where required. Examiner-ready by construction.

Human-in-the-loop by design, not by fear

Governance overlay is not a brake — it is a graduated autonomy model. Every anchor agent ships in **supervised mode**: human approves each material action for the first two weeks, then **reviewed mode** (human sees a queue of completed actions daily), then **audited mode** (autonomous with monthly Model Risk review). No agent runs unsupervised in production without an owner, a control matrix entry, and a monitoring cadence.

Deal-desk and claims-intake deployments compress cycle time by **40-60% in the first two quarters**. Compounds when combined with self-updating CRM.

Evidence Density

(Audit-defensible artifacts produced per material action)

Governed agents produce **audit-defensible evidence on every write**. The comparison is not to old workflow evidence — it is to what evidence you can produce today at all, and how fast.

THE FOURTH DIMENSION IS THE ONE THAT MATTERS

Hours, cost, and revenue are the numbers the CFO wants. **Evidence density is the number that changes what your compliance and risk functions can commit to.** It is what turns a two-month regulatory response into a two-week one, and a five-year examiner backlog into a query. This is the dimension enterprise buyers under-model most consistently.

What audit-ready actually looks like in practice.

The examiner is in the room. They ask the question every institution dreads: *show me every material action this AI took last quarter, with the policy that authorized it, the human who approved it where required, and the outcome.* Here is what that walkthrough looks like on the PCATS platform.

The five-minute walkthrough

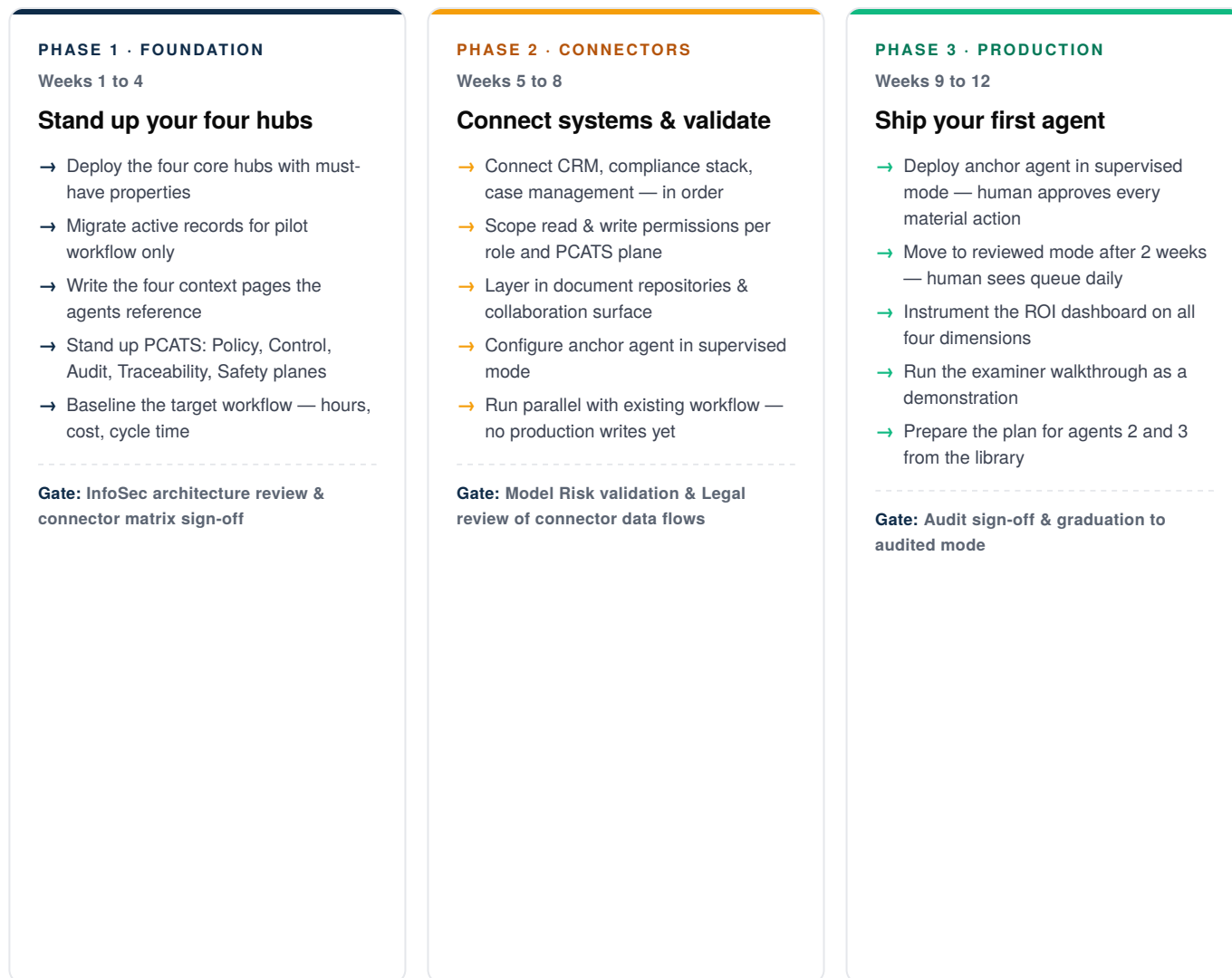
- 1 **Open the Audit plane, filter by agent and by date range.** Every action the KYC/AML agent took in Q2 is a row: actor, target counterparty, action taken, timestamp, policy cite, decision rationale, human approver (where required). **Query time: seconds.**
- 2 **Pick any row. Click "Show trace."** The Traceability plane returns the full reasoning path: input signals the agent saw, policy documents it cited, the exact model version that produced the output, and the reviewer who approved it (if in supervised mode). **No reconstruction. No memory.**
- 3 **Ask "show me the policy that authorized this action."** The Policy plane returns the specific control (SR 11-7 §, BSA/AML procedure ID, or internal policy version) that authorized the write — and every prior version of that control back to inception.
- 4 **Ask "were there any actions that violated policy?"** The Safety plane returns every flagged event, the guardrail that caught it, the escalation path taken, and the resolution. **Nothing hidden. Nothing implied.**
- 5 **Export the walkthrough as an evidence pack.** One click, one PDF, structured to the regulator's format — with citations, timestamps, hashes for tamper-evidence, and a chain of custody. **What used to be a six-week project is a report you generated during the meeting.**

THE TEST

The right question to ask any AI vendor selling to a regulated enterprise is not "how accurate is the model" — it is **"walk me through what happens when the examiner asks."** If the answer is "we would need to reconstruct that," the platform is not ready for regulated deployment. PCATS was built so the answer is a query.

Your 90-day plan with governance gates.

A regulated-enterprise rollout follows the three-step loop — but the timeline respects governance review, model risk validation, InfoSec sign-off, Legal review, and human-in-the-loop testing before any production write. Each phase ends in a named gate.



THE GATES ARE THE POINT

A ninety-day timeline in a regulated institution is not fast because we skipped the reviews. It is fast because **PCATS produces the artifacts the reviews depend on as first-class outputs of the platform** — not project deliverables assembled after the fact. Model Risk gets a model card. InfoSec gets a scoped connector matrix. Legal gets a data-flow map. Audit gets a queryable ledger. The gates pass because the evidence exists.

Where this fits in the longer journey.

This playbook is one artifact in a larger thesis: *The Autonomous Enterprise*, published quarterly through iProDecisions. The three-step loop is stage 3 of a four-stage arc every regulated institution is traveling — whether deliberately or by default. Knowing where you are on the arc is how you decide where to invest next.

One AI interface, many prompts. Better search, still no execution. Where enterprises land in 2025-2026 without a reference architecture.

STAGE 3

YOU ARE HERE

Governed Agent Execution

Agents act inside systems of record under PCATS. Audit trail as byproduct. Regulated workflows retire their manual reconciliation. This is the playbook you are reading.

STAGE 4

Context Capital

The institution's context — policies, precedents, decisions, model docs — becomes a compounding asset agents extend and enrich. The moat that competitors cannot copy.

The frameworks behind the playbook
